

**CO-ADMISSION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
ELIZABETH CITY STATE UNIVERSITY  
AND  
VANCE-GRANVILLE COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
November 10, 2020**

Elizabeth City State University (ECSU) and Vance-Granville Community College enter into a co-admission agreement. The agreement is designed to improve transfer student access and success through a collaborative baccalaureate degree program.

**Partnership Objectives:**

- Improve access to baccalaureate degree programs
- Improve transfer retention and graduation rates
- Provide students with a seamless degree-completion pathway
- Improve efficiency to degree completion
- Remove student success barriers
- Optimize student services and resources
- Prepare students to succeed in a global society
- Strengthen the partnership and relationship between ECSU and Vance-Granville Community College

**Requirements:**

- Students must be in their first year of community college enrollment prior to applying for co-admission.
- Students must submit a complete co-admissions application.
- Students must complete an associate of arts, an associate of science, or an associate of fine arts degree program and maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Prior to registering for ECSU classes, students must provide immunization documentation, complete the Campus Safety Questions, and meet admissions requirements as stated in the ECSU Undergraduate Catalog.

**Student Benefits:**


- Guaranteed admission to ECSU upon completion of an associate of arts, an associate of science, or an associate of fine arts degree
- Waived ECSU application fee
- Guaranteed admission to ECSU majors and programs of study \*
- Regularly scheduled onsite or virtual meetings with the ECSU Transfer Admission Counselor as the Point of Contact (POC)
- Joint virtual academic advising – ECSU program of study faculty will be assigned to relative program participants
- Assistance with active duty and veteran education benefits and resources
- Scheduled on-site or virtual classroom presentations by ECSU faculty (speaker forums)
- Joint virtual financial aid counseling: ECSU Financial aid POC will be available
- Eligible to receive an ECSU student ID card, which guarantee student rates/entrance to athletic events, etc.
- Access to the ECSU Library online resources
- Access to programming through the Office of Student Activities and Organizations at ECSU
- Access to North Carolina Community College Event Days hosted onsite or virtually by ECSU

ECSU and Vance-Granville Community College commit to maximizing student success and will annually review this partnership agreement.

\*For co-admission into Teacher Education and Social Work, the following specific requirements must be met before admittance into the program.

- A. Teacher Education Program: Complete the "Teacher Education Application"; meet with the advisor, complete a criminal background check with *certified background.com*; complete 15 hours of field experience and EDUC 210; have a minimum of 2.8 GPA or higher; satisfactory interview; acceptable writing sample; and satisfy Praxis Core or have acceptable SAT/ACT scores.
- B. Social Work Program: Complete ENGL 102, ENGL 103, SOWK 205, BIO 100 or 207, SOC 201 and PSY 212; meet with the advisor; submit departmental "Application for Admission"; complete "Personal Statement" administered by the Social Work faculty; submit two letters of recommendation; minimum GPA of 2.50 or higher; and agree to abide by University policies and the National Association of Social Works (NASW) Code of Ethics.
